

Treasurer's Report

Dear Friends and Supporters of the Flying Gravity Circus,

As we approach Flying Gravity's 25th year, the organization is in the midst of rapid growth and transformation. The circus has roughly doubled in size in just two years—from a budgeted senior-troupe enrollment of 27 in 2021 to 46 for 2023. The staffing increases necessary to support the higher enrollment brings many benefits for the troupers—a broader range of skills and perspectives, and more individual coaching, for example. But the organization is also more complex and more resources are needed behindthe-scenes to make the programs successful.

The need for non-tuition funding has also grown substantially as we work to support the best quality programs for the troupers at an affordable cost. Tuition typically covers about two-thirds of the income necessary to run the

circus. The other third is primarily from grants, donations, and sponsorships (shown as Fundraising in the budgetary chart to the right), with a small portion coming from troupe performances. Meeting the challenge of developing these non-tuition income sources is crucial to our transformation to a


larger organization, and our goal is to lower tuition prices, while continuing to expand opportunities for the troupers.

Financial Aid is essential to fulfilling Flying Gravity's mission. We were able to award \$23,940 in financial aid for the 2022 fiscal year, and have already awarded over \$37,000 for the current year.


